Summary of progress (Discuss concepts identified in the course, learning plan progress, skills)

You have currently completed 48 clinical hours.

Safety and Accountability

Reem, you always wear PPE including mask, face shield, gown, and gloves per covid protocols, to ensure your safety and the safety of your patients. You are compliant with hand-washing hygiene when entering and leaving patients' rooms and at all points of care. You demonstrate safe holding techniques of a newborn by always using two hands and supporting the infant's head. You understand the education behind safe water temperature when bathing an infant.

Communication and Caring

Reem, you are compassionate in the care that you provide your patients. You form therapeutic nurse-client relationships with ease. You consistently provide education to new parents about their infant while demonstrating newborn care. You communicate well with your peers and staff on the unit, ensuring that your co-assigned nurse is aware of your scope of practice when beginning your shift. You complete comfort rounds and attend to the needs of your patients by providing blankets and water as needed. You shadowed an RN on the Labour and Delivery side of the unit and provided support to the patient throughout their labour.
