Summary of progress (Discuss concepts identified in the course, learning plan progress, skills) Reem has demonstrated safe practices for her patient by ensuring she checks the original physician's medication orders with the CMAR before proceeding to administer medication, she observes all rights of medication administration doing safety checks and filling out proper documentation. On her medication day, Reem made sure to have her patient's medications properly researched having knowledge of what she was giving, why and what side effects could potentially result. On her medication day Reem delivered oral, NG and IV medication, she was capable of carrying out the task as well as programming the IV pump. Reem has safely completed several simple dressing changes, trach care, several sterile dressing changes with packing, cared for many patients with an IV, NG, foley catheters as well as completed proper documentation for such, has cared for and removed a heparin lock, has completed assessments, vital signs, accuchecks and completed proper documentation. Kim is also demonstrates accountability for patients who are restrained and is aware of the policy and responsibility on the part of the caregiver when patients are either chemically or mechanically restrained.

Reem communicates well with peers, patients and team members.

Reem keeps her co-assign nurses up to date with patient status.

Agreeably, she demonstrates strong communication skills in the clinical setting with the care team, her patients and peers. Reem's charting is accurate and concise, focusing on priority diagnosis and directing her care towards goals that are achievable and appropriate for the patient.

Reem can easily care for a three patient assignment, is well organized completing all tasks, helps her colleagues, and gets time for breaks. Reem passed her medication test on the first attempt. She demonstrates critical thinking by obtaining vital signs before giving cardiac medications with indications to hold. Reem ensures comfort for her patients by repositioning them frequently and as needed, also giving required bowel routine and documenting bowel regimen per policy. Reem also uses critical thinking when performing procedures with her patients such as wound packing; she will pre-emptively give pain relievers to reduce her patients discomfort.

Reem is a vital part of the health care team, she eagerly accepts her assignment, communicates well with his peers, patients, and team members and demonstrates excellent skills in delegation and communication. Reem displays leadership qualities through her willingness to learn, her hard-work and positive attitude.
