Details

Summary of progress (Discuss concepts identified in the course, learning plan progress, skills)

Reem had her community preceptorship at the WECHU in the IDP department. Through the term she has been able to learn more about communicable diseases such as monkeypox, West Nile Virus, Lyme Disease and food borne reportable disease. She is learning about Diseases of Public Health Significance (DOPHS), the role of CD in investigating, reporting, investigating and follow up for monkeypox. Lately she worked with a new case of Neisseria Meningococcal and Giardia and worked with high priority cases and their contacts. At midterm she was working independently on a new case of monkeypox, following case and contact protocols and IPHIS data entry and daily monitoring per ministry guidelines. She had an opportunity to attend a home visit for a client with TB. She completed all CPEs, completed 192 hours which included 8 hours of clinical conference, 8 hours for Integrated rounds and 8 hours of prep for these. She was team leader for conference 1 and shared their community assessment on teens in DT Windsor with our clinical group. They participated in head to toe review, medication questions and discussion about harm reduction, safe injection sites, communication as a barrier and gap for children and caregivers in grade 7/8.. For Integrated Rounds they discussed a case scenario on "Eric", a homosexual male who engages in high risk behaviours and has a change in health status. She led the group that day on phase 1 (scenario, assessment, analysis) and throughout the day with debriefing and facilitating discussions. Reem showed exemplary leadership and excellent group collaboration. Peer feedback competed twice on all group members. Learning plan goals met to learn more about monkeypox and increase independence with vaccine process.

Strengths (Things you did well consistently):

Critical thinking/Problem Solving: uses up-to-date, daily monitoring per Ministry guidelines and applying case and contact protocols, she demonstrates critical thinking during Integrated rounds on how this could have been prevented as well as community supports available... Communication/Collaboration: Reem has found resources in the community and through WECHU website to support clients and families as well in other languages. She refers a client to their family Dr. for more information on their child's infection when they did not understand over the phone

QI/CE/Advocate for improvements in Health care system: contacted Canadian Blood Services re: blood testing protocols, participated in meeting on use of bed covers on bedpans as a way to reduce transmission. Reem suggested using an excel spreadsheet to track future doses for monkeypox

Leadership: Reem shows excellent leadership qualities when sharing ideas and knowledge, actively engaging with peers, and sharing specific feedback with peers

Professionalism/Initiative: Reem has shown professionalism in all emails, conferences, IR and actively participates and shares ideas in conferences. She understands the critical nature of maintaining confidentiality in this field and professionally managed a case in the community

Areas for Improvement/Growth (Things you need to work on): Must be addressed in your learning plan for the next clinical experience Recommendations: I have no specific concerns. Reem has shown exemplary leadership through her professional attitude, role modeling during conference and IR and always sharing knowledge and engaging with her peers. Utilize feedback from all assignments for next 6 weeks. Utilize and incorporate peer feedback provided. Review head to toe and medication calculations before next rotation. Continue to incorporate evidence based practice into your clinical decisions and ensure you always look at the person holistically, with a compassionate lens and consider harm reduction, trauma informed approaches when appropriate as well as client and family centred care.
